FROM STUDENT SERVICES...

The Student Services team at K.R.H.S. would like to welcome back all students and would like to especially welcome our Grade 9 students to our school. We hope that you all have an awesome school year. Our team consists of many people within the school, but the two that you will see most often are *Lori Allen and Jessica McCarthy*. Let us introduce ourselves.

Jessica McCarthy is the School Counsellor at KRHS. She can help students talk about issues happening with friends, family or internally. She is also here to help students plan for their futures, so if you are looking for information on jobs, post secondary institutes or programs send her an email, or visit her in her office upstairs by the library. Mrs. McCarthy can accommodate students all blocks of the day, both semesters.

Lori Allen is the Youth Service Worker at *KRHS*. She can help students with many of the same personal issues as Mrs. McCarthy. She can also be found in classrooms supporting students. Lori can be found in her office, in the downstairs hallway, Blocks B and C & D first semester.

Both Lori and Jessica might be pulling students from classrooms throughout the year. This happens for many different reasons such as giving the student a message, answering a question about university to chatting about a personal issue. We ask that other students not make a big deal about this and not to tease any student who is pulled from class. Of course, if you don't feel comfortable with either Lori or Jessica coming to your classroom, please let them know and they will find alternate arrangements.

Finally, Lori and Jessica want to be there to support students and keep things as confidential as possible, but they always like to remind students of their limits to confidentiality. If you tell them something that meets any of these criteria, they have a legal duty to inform someone else: a) you are thinking of hurting yourself or someone else, b) you talk about someone hurting you or c) if they are legally required to share information.

ALUMNI UPDATE...

Where are those K.R.H.S. grads now?

~ K.R.H.S. Grad of 2017 Meghan Morrell recently graduated from the University of Prince Edward Island with a Bachelor of Science degree, majoring in Kinesiology and minoring in Biomedical Physics.

~ K.R.H.S. Grad of 2018 Callie Thomson is one of only twenty-two post-graduate students to join the *Consortium on Analytics for Data-Driven Decision making (CAnD3) training program* as a *Fellow* of the 2023/2024 cohort. CAnD3's primary goal is to collaboratively develop, implement, and deliver an innovative training program - Population Analytics in an Aging Society – to equip the next generation of academic and applied population researchers with the knowledge, skills, and networks to support data-driven decision-making in aging societies. This fellowship award is valued at \$5,000 from CAnD3/McGill University and \$5,000 from Mount Saint Vincent University. Callie is a Masters degree student at Mount Saint Vincent University, where she is currently entering her second year in the *Department of Family Studies* and Gerontology. Previously, she graduated from the University of Prince Edward Island with a Bachelor of Science degree in Biology, Specialization in Life Sciences, and Minors in Biomedical Physics and Psychology. Currently, Callie holds a Research Assistant position at the Nova Scotia Centre on Aging, where she is involved with projects surrounding a systematic review of caregivers within the province.



<u>ANNUAL K.R.H.S. FROZEN PIE</u> <u>FUNDRAISER SEPT. 25 TO OCT. 10</u>

The Student Council has started fundraising for the current school year. Just in time to stock your freezer for the holidays - Kinkora Regional High School is once again holding our very popular *frozen pie fundraiser from Sept. 25 to Oct. 10.* All pies come frozen and ready to bake, with the exception of the pumpkin pie, which is thaw and serve. It is important that orders are picked up on that day as there is no freezer space available at the school to store pies.



SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING MINUTE FOR SEPTEMBER Identifying Your Feelings

Did you know that one way to help control your feelings is being able to use the right language to describe what you feel? In the counselling world we call it "name it to tame it". Often, we can identify the basic emotion of sad, mad, scared or happy, but emotions words can be much more descriptive and therefore better able to identify the feeling. The *feelings wheel* is a great way to help you find the more descriptive feeling word. Start with your basic emotion and work out towards the edge of the wheel to find your more descriptive word. Once you know it, you will interact with that feeling in a much different way and will hopefully "tame" your reaction to it.
