Where are those K.R.H.S. grads now?

- ~ K.R.H.S. Grad of 2022 Mya Moffatt is in her second year of the four-year *Bachelor of Health Science* degree program in *Respiratory Therapy* at *Dalhousie University School of Health Sciences* in Halifax, N.S.
- ~ K.R.H.S. Grad of 2022 Morgan McLean is in his second year of the four-year Sustainable Design Engineering degree program at the University of Prince Edward Island. Eleven UPEI Faculty of Sustainable Design Engineering teams, composed of a total of 41 students, competed at the 2024 Atlantic Engineering Competition at University of New Brunswick in Fredericton from January 19 to 21. Six of the UPEI teams will move on to the prestigious Canadian Engineering Competition in Calgary, Alberta. DENTAL CLINIC

The School Oral Health Preventative Program will be operating at Kinkora Regional High School beginning early February 2024.

Purpose of Dental Clinic: Screen children to assess risk of oral disease; provide oral health education, topical fluoride, scaling/polishing and sealants, according to your child's individual needs.

Screening: All students will be seen for a two-minute screening to determine their risk of oral disease. If you do not wish your child to have this dental screening, please notify the school.

Consent: After the screening, all children will be given a consent form which will be necessary for you to complete and return before services are provided.

Fees: There is no cost involved as these preventative services are covered by the Provincial Dental Care Program.
