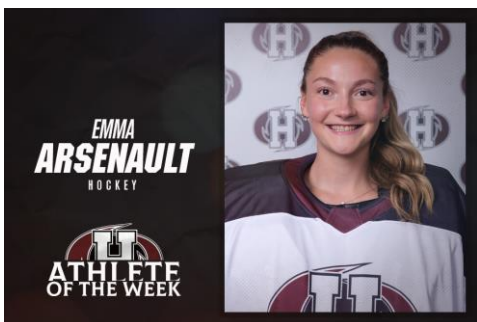

ALUMNI UPDATE...

Where are those K.R.H.S. grads now?

~ **K.R.H.S. Grad of 2021 Emma Arsenault** helped the *Holland College Hurricanes Women's Hockey Team* win their third-straight *Atlantic Collegiate Hockey Association (ACHA) Championship*. The games took place in Cape Breton from March 7-9. Emma, a fourth-year goaltender, earned *Hurricanes Athlete of the Week honours* for the first time this season and *Hurricanes Women's Hockey Player of the Week honours* for the second time. After recording a 4-4-1 regular-season record with a 2.67 goals-against-average and 0.928 save percentage, she peaked at the perfect time, saving her best performances for last. In three games, she recorded three wins, one shutout (2-0 against CBU, denied all 36 shots), 100 saves on 102 shots, a 0.67 goals-against-average, and a 0.980 save percentage. Since her first ACHA Championship final in 2022, she has won three of the last four, continuing her legacy as *one of the greatest goaltenders in team history*. Emma was named to the *2024-25 ACHA 2nd All-Star Team*.



~ **K.R.H.S. Grad of 2013 Dr. Ryan Murray**, a Sub-Lieutenant in the Royal Canadian Air Force, just finished a voluntary call-out at the recent *Invictus Games*, Feb. 8-16 in Vancouver & Whistler, B.C. as one of seven *medical officers*. He is doing his *medical residency* right now in Newfoundland & Labrador.

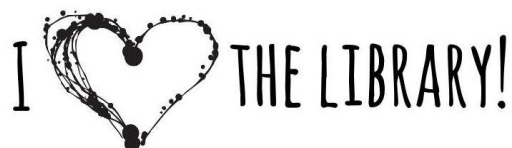
~ **K.R.H.S. Grad of 1976 Dave Cameron** recently had his *500th win as a coach in the Ontario Hockey League*. This is currently in his fourth season at the helm with the *Ottawa 67's*. His OHL coaching tenure began in 1997-98 with the Soo Greyhounds before leading to other stops in Toronto and Mississauga. He also served as *head coach of the NHL's Ottawa Senators* from 2014-16 while working assistant assignments in both Ottawa and Calgary.

The McIver Family Scholarship. This scholarship is intended for a student in their graduating year at Kinkora Regional High School, who has demonstrated leadership skills and worked or volunteered in the Agriculture Sector and will be attending post-secondary in the fall immediately following graduation.

The St. Clair & Clara Duffy Memorial Scholarship. This scholarship is intended for a graduating student(s) from Kinkora Regional High School that combines a strong work ethic, involvement in school activities and community involvement and demonstrates financial need. This student(s) must be attending a post-secondary institution immediately following graduation, in the fall of the year the scholarship is awarded.

Catherine & Helena Yeo Scholarship. This scholarship is for graduating students who reside in Prince County (Kensington Intermediate/Senior High School, Kinkora Regional High School, Three Oaks High School, Westisle Composite High School, École Évangéline, École Pierre-Chiasson & École-sur-Mer) and need financial support to continue their education.

DENTAL CLINIC

The School Oral Health Preventative Program will soon be operating at Kinkora Regional High School.

Purpose of Dental Clinic: Screen children to assess risk of oral disease; provide oral health education, topical fluoride, scaling/polishing and sealants, according to your child's individual needs.

Screening: All students will be seen for a two-minute screening to determine their risk of oral disease. If you do not wish your child to have this dental screening, please notify the school.

Consent: After the screening, all children will be given a consent form which will be necessary for you to complete and return before services are provided.

Fees: There is no cost involved as these preventative services are covered by the Provincial Dental Care Program.
