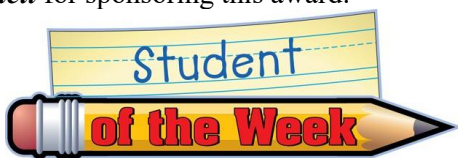

at Credit Union Place on May 7. Great turn-out.

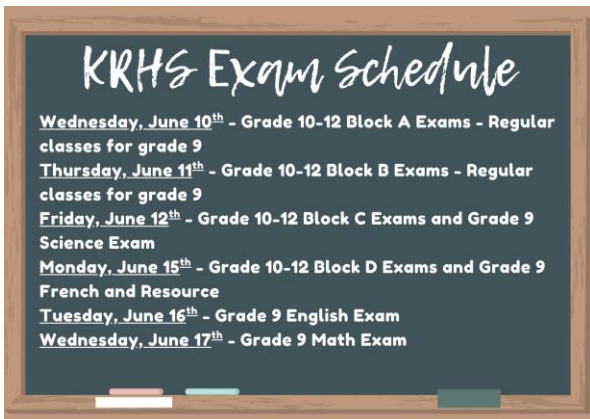


**THANK YOU IN ADVANCE**

#### Grad News from Student Services

1. Any grad who thinks they will be applying to the *St. Dunstan's Bursary* program in August, must request an official copy of your transcript be mailed from KRHS before the end of June. Please see Mrs. McCarthy for this request. You must be Catholic in order to apply
2. All final transcripts will be emailed to grads using the secure document delivery method from February. ***Please check your school email accounts after exams to download a copy of your transcript.***

**\*\*REMINDER TO ALL GRADS:** All grads are reminded to let Mrs. McCarthy know if they have won a scholarship outside of school. ***She needs to have a copy of the official letter or email that offered you the award in order to recognize this achievement in the graduation program.*** In the coming weeks, you may start to hear back about scholarships and awards you have won. If you would like to be recognized for these awards on graduation night (which we suggest you do!), Mrs. McCarthy needs a copy of the official email or letter in order to put it in the graduation program. We do **not** receive notification at the school so we are depending on graduates to share this information with us. If Mrs. McCarthy doesn't have a copy of the official letter, then it won't be announced on graduation night.

#### **Upcoming Scholarship DEADLINES:**

**August 31 – St. Dunstan's Bursaries** (a reminder to grads that transcripts for the SDU Bursaries need to be sent from the school before the end of the school year, even though they are due in August)

**August 31 - Connolly Estate bursaries** are open to residents of PEI who are full-time students enrolled in an undergraduate program at an accredited university. In addition, applicants must demonstrate that they are Roman Catholic, are Irish in heritage, and have material financial need (parental income applies if applicant is under 22). College students who are completing a joint program/degree must be

enrolled in the university portion of their studies to be eligible.

Apply at [www.owenconnollyestate.com](http://www.owenconnollyestate.com) by the end of the day of August 31. The online application will be available the first of July. Recent bursaries have been in the range of \$2,000/year, though they vary depending on market returns and the number of applicants. Bursaries are available for a maximum of four years.

Did you know that you *can earn money towards a bursary at the end of Grade 12 by volunteering in your community?* Students can register with the program after their Grade 9 year and can collect credit for up to 150 hours of volunteer work. ### YEARBOOK NEWS

Mrs. McCarthy is looking for yearbook editors for the 2026-27 school year. The yearbook editor position plays an important role within our school. They must possess the following qualities to be successful in the role:

- ✓ **ABILITY TO WORK WELL WITH OTHERS:** as a yearbook editor, you must have the ability to talk to all students in the school. The editor(s) will need to ask grads for information on a regular basis and find creative ways to do this. They will need to communicate well with the staff advisor and and/or a co-editor on what has been accomplished and what is still needed. An ideal candidate would be have a welcoming personality and feel comfortable speaking to anyone.
- ✓ **ABILITY TO WORK INDEPENDANTLY:** yearbook editors set their own schedules and need to meet deadlines without prompting from the staff advisor. It is strongly recommended that editors take a CWS credit to have time to complete the yearbook. If they do not take CWS they will need to commit to after school hours
- ✓ **ATTENTION TO DETAIL:** editors need to pay attention to the fine details of the yearbook from spelling mistakes, misalignments on photos to scale and not be satisfied until it is right

- ✓ **ABILITY TO EFFECTIVELY USE TECHNOLOGY:** The yearbook is done completely with a web-based program which needs to be learned and problem solved with. Editors are also responsible for the grad video (again usually a web-based program) which is typically shown during the Grad Gala.

### K.R.H.S. LIBRARY NEWS

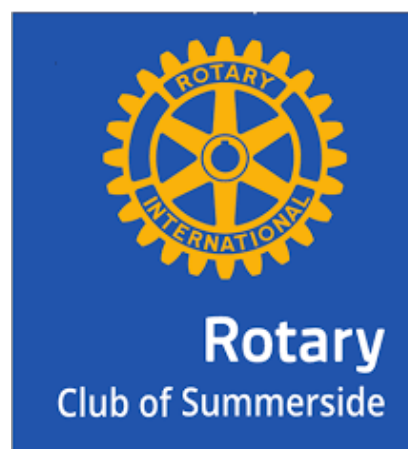
